### HOUSING, CONSTRUCTION, AND GOVERNANCE

#### MICAH 4:4

*“Everyone will sit under their own vine and under their own fig tree, and no one will make them afraid.”*

#### PSALM 127:1

*“Unless the Lord builds the house, the builders labor in vain.”*

#### ISAIAH 5:8

*“Woe to you who add house to house and join field to field till no space is left and you live alone in the land.”*

Housing and construction are mirrors reflecting the quality of governance in any nation. The way homes are built, cities are planned, and public projects are delivered reveals whether leaders exercise stewardship, justice, and foresight - or whether governance is weak, corrupt, and exclusionary. In many ways, governance is not tested in theory but in the tangible structures where people live, work, and thrive.

### Policy and Regulation: Rules That Shape Communities

Governments wield enormous influence over housing and construction through zoning laws, building codes, and land tenure policies. These frameworks determine what is built, where, and how.
