In today’s world, Information and Communication Technology (ICT) is no longer optional — it is the nervous system that connects citizens, businesses, and government. ICT shapes how nations deliver services, grow their economies, safeguard security, and engage globally.

For Uganda, ICT has been a fast-growing sector, with innovations like mobile money, internet penetration reaching over 50%, and a youthful population embracing digital tools. But governance determines whether ICT becomes a driver of inclusion and prosperity — or a source of inequality, surveillance, and corruption.

1. ICT as a Driver of Economic Growth

- ICT contributes to GDP through telecoms, fintech, and digital entrepreneurship.
- Mobile money revolutionized financial access, enabling millions without bank accounts to transact.
- ICT can enhance agriculture, tourism, education, and healthcare through innovation.

Governance Role:

- Policies that support start-ups and local tech talent.
- Investments in ICT infrastructure (broadband, electricity, data centers).
- Regulating telecoms for fair competition.

2. ICT and Service Delivery in Governance

- **E-Government:** Digitized tax collection, land registries, and national IDs reduce bureaucracy and corruption.
- **Public Accountability:** ICT can make budgets, procurement, and services transparent.
- **Efficiency:** Digital systems reduce costs and time in government operations.

Challenges:

- Corruption in ICT tenders.
- Poor internet in rural areas.
- Limited digital literacy among citizens.

3. ICT and Inclusion

- Uganda's young population is tech-savvy, but rural communities, women, and the elderly risk being excluded.
- ICT can either reduce inequality (through e-learning, mobile money, telemedicine) or widen it if access is limited.

Governance Role:

- Expand rural broadband and electricity.
- Invest in ICT training and innovation hubs.
- Promote affordable devices and services.

Isaiah 54:2 — “Enlarge the place of your tent... lengthen your cords, strengthen your stakes.”

4. ICT, Security, and Governance

- ICT provides tools for law enforcement, national security, and border management.
- But it also creates risks: cybercrime, online fraud, and data breaches.
- Governance must balance digital rights (freedom of expression, privacy) with security.

5. ICT and Global Competitiveness

- Uganda competes in a global digital economy.
- Countries that invest in ICT leapfrog into prosperity.
- Uganda's Vision 2040 emphasizes ICT as a cornerstone for development.

Governance Role:

- Build policies that attract investment in ICT.
- Support research and innovation.
- Position Uganda as an East African digital hub.

6. Governance Failures in ICT

- High internet taxes (e.g., OTT/social media tax) discourage use and innovation.
- Poor ICT project management wastes public resources.

UGANDA’S MOBILE MONEY REVOLUTION

Before 2009, most Ugandans had no access to formal banking. Less than **20% of** adults held bank accounts, particularly in rural areas. Sending or receiving money was costly and unsafe.

In 2009, MTN Uganda and Uganda Telecom launched mobile money services. With just a basic phone, Ugandans could now deposit, send, and withdraw money through agents spread across villages and towns.

The Revolution

- **Rapid Growth:** Within a decade, mobile money became the dominant form of financial service in Uganda.
 - By 2023, Uganda had 35+ million registered accounts (more than the adult population).
 - Over UGX 100 trillion (≈ USD 26 billion) flows annually through mobile money systems.
- **Financial Inclusion:** Mobile money brought banking to the unbanked — especially rural farmers, women, and youth.
- **Economic Transformation:** It enabled:
 - **Small business growth** (easy payments).
 - **Remittances** from urban to rural areas.
 - **Government collections** (taxes, fees, utility payments).
 - **Savings & loans** through fintech innovation.

Ecclesiastes 11:2 — “Invest in seven ventures, yes, in eight; you do not know what disaster may come upon the land.”— Mobile money became a tool for resilience in crisis.

Governance Dimensions

1. Policy & Regulation

- The Bank of Uganda and Uganda Communications Commission regulated mobile money to protect users.
- In 2020, Parliament passed the National Payments Systems Act, giving mobile money a clear legal framework.

2. Challenges in Governance

- Fraud and theft (SIM swaps, scams).
- Over-taxation: The 2018 OTT tax and mobile money tax discouraged usage, sparking public outcry.
- Regulatory gaps between telecoms and banks.

3. Impact on Governance

- Improved tax collection and revenue flows.
- Greater transparency in government fees.

- Empowered citizens through faster financial access.

Proverbs 13:23 — “The field of the poor may produce much food, but it is swept away through injustice.” — governance determines whether innovations bless the poor or burden them.

Lessons Learned

- **Positive:** When governance supports innovation, ICT can transform lives faster than traditional systems.
- **Negative:** When governance overtaxes or regulates poorly, it stifles growth and burdens citizens.
- **Opportunity:** Uganda can expand mobile money into agriculture, health, and education payments to strengthen inclusion.

Conclusion: ICT as a Stewardship Test for Governance


ICT is a powerful tool — it can build nations or break them. Governance determines whether ICT serves as a platform for justice, service delivery, innovation, and opportunity, or as an instrument of oppression and exclusion. Uganda must govern ICT with vision, integrity, and inclusivity.
