THE NEXT ADMINSTRATION 2026 - 2031

DEUTERONOMY 1:13-15

Choose for your tribes wise, understanding, and experienced men, and I will appoint them as your heads.' And you answered me, 'The thing that you have spoken is good for us to do.' So I took the heads of your tribes, wise and experienced men, and set them as heads over you, commanders of thousands, commanders of hundreds, commanders of fifties, commanders of tens, and officers, throughout your tribes.

UGANDA'S NEW ADMINISTRATION (2026 - 2031) AND THE STEWARDSHIP OF GOVERNANCE

On 12th May 2026, Uganda will usher in a new administration following the general elections of 2026. This moment will not only mark a political transition but also a spiritual and moral responsibility. For the next five years, those entrusted with power will carry the hopes, struggles, and aspirations of more than 48 million Ugandans.

Uganda's new administration will step into office with both opportunities and challenges: a youthful population eager for jobs, communities hungry for justice, regions demanding equity, and a nation yearning for unity. To succeed, governance in 2026 - 2031 must be rooted in vision, discipline, integrity, and accountability.

1. Vision and Direction for Uganda (2026 - 2031)

5. Social Development

The future of Uganda rests in its youthful population. The next five years must be marked by investment in education, health, and skills development. Schools must be properly staffed and resourced, hospitals must have medicines and motivated health workers, and universities must produce graduates equipped for today's economy.



6. Peace and Security

Without peace, development is impossible. Uganda's security forces must be disciplined, professional, and protective of citizens' rights. The new government must also continue Uganda's role in stabilizing the East African region while ensuring peace at home.

7. Integrity and Accountability

Uganda's greatest weakness in governance has been corruption and impunity. The 2026 - 2031 administration must be different: leaders must model humility, resist greed, and serve with integrity. Appointments and tenders must be transparent, and citizens must see accountability in action.

Micah 6:8 - "To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God."

8. The Immediate Post-Election Season

The period after elections is always sensitive in Uganda. Tensions often rise around results and transitions. Yet scripture reminds us:

Psalm 33:8-12

Blessed is the nation whose God is the Lord, the people whom he has chosen as his heritage!"

Uganda's 2026 elections and the inauguration of a new administration must align with God's counsel. True peace and progress will not come from political schemes but from leadership submitted to God's wisdom.

- Pray for the president, parliament, judiciary, and local leaders to govern with integrity and humility.
- Ask God to raise leaders like Joseph (visionary), Esther (courageous), and Nehemiah (selfless) in Uganda.

1 Timothy 2:1–2 - Pray for "kings and all those in authority..."

4. Prayer for Citizens

- Pray for Ugandans to embrace civic responsibility paying taxes, rejecting bribery, respecting laws.
- Pray that citizens will vote, serve, and work for the common good.

Romans 12:10 - "Honor one another above yourselves."

5. Prayer for the Post-Election Period

- Pray for peace, transparency, and justice in the announcement of results.
- Pray that winners will be humble and losers gracious, ensuring national stability.

6. Blessing for Uganda's Future (2026–2031)

- Declare that Uganda will be governed with justice, integrity, and vision.
- Proclaim that the 2026 2031 administration will strengthen institutions, empower youth, and unite the nation.

PROCLAMATION OVER THE NEXT ADMINISTRATION 2026-2031
